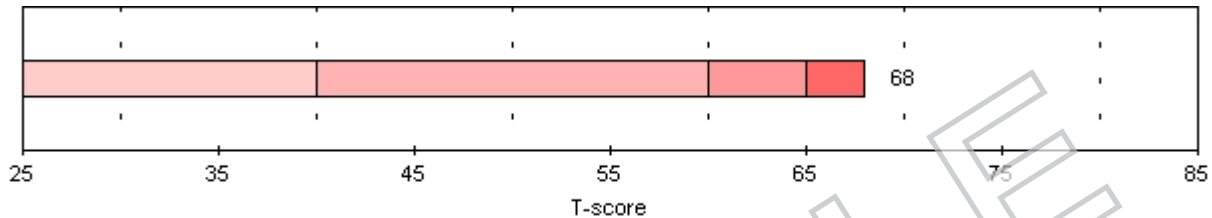
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Overview

The Autism Spectrum Rating Scales Short Form (6-18 Years) [ASRS Short Form (6-18 Years)] is a 15-item scale designed to differentiate youth with Autism Spectrum Disorder from those in the general population, and those with other clinical disorders. High scores suggest that many behaviors associated with Autism Spectrum Disorder have been observed. The ASRS Short Form (6-18 Years) can be re-administered over time in order to assess response to treatment. This computerized report provides quantitative information about the ratings of the youth. Additional interpretive information can be found in the *ASRS Technical Manual*. This Interpretive Report is intended for use by qualified assessors only.

T-score

The following graph provides the ASRS Short Form (6-18 Years) T-score.



Summary

Ratings on the ASRS Short Form (6-18 Years) yielded a T-score of 68 (90% Confidence Interval = 62-71), which is ranked at the 96th Percentile and falls in the Elevated Score range. Some behavioral characteristics that are similar to the behaviors of youth diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder were reported. This suggests that further evaluation may be appropriate.
